1. Go to the [Serials Copyright Research Project-Claim Title Range spreadsheet](#). "Claim" the range of titles you will research. Enter your name in the "Claimed by (name)" column. The spreadsheet is automatically saved.

You can copy the 1st title in a range (*highlight; Ctrl+c*) to make it easier to find on the deep backfiles page. Titles are separated by double hyphens.

When you have completed researching the titles in your claimed range, return to the spreadsheet and enter "Done" in the "Done if completed" column. "Claim" another range of titles when you are ready to research more titles.

2. Go to the [Penn Libraries deep backfiles page](#). Find the 1st title in your claimed range (*Ctrl+f to open your browser's search box; Ctrl+v to paste in the title*).
